THIS WEEK

MATH: We reviewed multiplication by solving multi-step word problems. Students took an online test for chapter 2 covering standards 4.NBT.5 and 4.OA.1. In addition, they practiced math problem solving skills on ST Math.

READING: Students read several short stories this week and practiced identifying the theme or main idea of the story. They took a third assessment on theme (RL.2) by reading the myth "Mercury and the Woodman" and then identifying its big idea.

SOCIAL STUDIES:

Students completed a map of Utah's main rivers, lakes, and reservoirs. They also turned in a paper describing six of Utah's natural resources.

FRENCH: Students started reading a new story this week about an unlikely hero who throws himself between a swan and an elf. We continued to practice when to use TO BE (ETRE) or TO HAVE (AVOIR) when writing.
